# Social economy in the life of Europeans

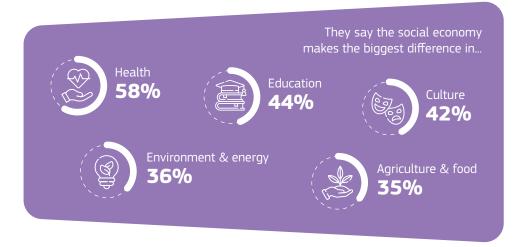

### Social economy organisations prioritise people, communities and the environment over profits.

In Europe, over 4 million of them employ 11.5 million people in a variety of sectors such as social services, healthcare, social housing, renewable energy, circular economy, agriculture, media and recreation. They play a crucial role in tackling societal challenges and promote fair working conditions by involving employees in governance. They often create opportunities for underrepresented groups, such as women and young people, and many work to make the digital and green transitions fair and inclusive.

**5 in 4**Europeans believe the social economy is **important for the well-being of society** 





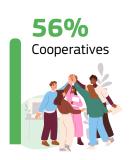
### Social economy organisations are widely recognised,

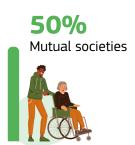
although only about half of Europeans are familiar with the term "social economy".

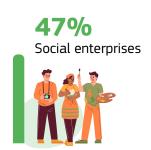
The most recognised social economy organisations are...
